School uniform recycling

We are hoping to set up our own school uniform bank to support our school community as we know how quickly children grow and how expensive uniform can be. Our intention is to build up a stock of school uniform, winter coats and PE kit which your children have outgrown and then offer it to families who need it.

If you have any school uniform which could be reused, please hand it in to the school. Families will be able to request uniform privately through the app which can be sent home discreetly in children's school bags: details of how to request this will follow.

One way system in the playground

To keep everyone safe, please continue to use the one way system. The gate at Everard Rise is for ENTRY ONLY and the Clement Rise is EXIT ONLY, except for those who need access via the ramp. Parents are asked to wear a mask in the playground.

We would also ask parents to minimise their waiting time in the playground and to maintain their distance from others. The guidelines are in place to keep everyone safe, especially your children and your support with this is appreciated.

Please note that Parents/Carers are not permitted in the school without prior arrangement.

School car park

The school car park should only be used by parents dropping children off at the nursery. Please do not access the school playground through the car park as this has the potential to cause serious accidents. Pupils should only access the playground from the gates as per the one way system.

NHS guidelines

Please just follow the guidance we have and self-isolate / book a test for the following symptoms:

- Persistent cough
- Fever
- Loss of smell or taste

You do not need to isolate for a runny nose or a sore throat. If your child is unwell you would keep them off school <u>as usual</u> and this would be recorded in the same way it always was.

If in doubt, please phone the school.

Self-isolating and working at home

We are only able to provide work for children who have received advice from Trace and Protect or a medical professional (not including quarantine resulting from travel). This may be physical work sent home or via technology links as appropriate to their age.

Please pop any donation you wish to give in an envelope and send it in with your child for them to receive a poppy.
