Dogs
Please remember that dogs are not allowed on the playground, either on a lead or carried. We would also ask that if you are waiting for children at the gates with a dog that you stand back from the gate to allow children and families to pass. We know that the one way system does make it more difficult, but our staff will bring the younger children within sight of the Cedric Rise gate at the end of the day for you to meet them there.
You may know that your dog normally behaves, but some of our children do not and may be scared. Thank you for your understanding.

We have noticed that a growing number of children are arriving late and entering through the front door. Please ensure that children are in school before 8:45am and enter through the playground entrance. The doors to school are open from 8:30am and the breakfast club is open from 8:10am.
